Tip of the Week

Just like other functions of language, *answering questions*, is a skill that children develop over time through experience and engagement in conversation. The complexity of the wording of questions often plays a part in helping the child to understand and then form an appropriate response. As the child gets older they are able to process more complex questions. Try following these simple steps to simplify questions when speaking to your child.

The following list highlights age appropriate structured questions to be asked.



Age Guidelines for Asking ?

2 years	yes/no	"Johnny go?"
2 years	What	"What's that?"
3 years	Where	"Where's mommy?"
3 years	Who	"Who's that?"
4-5 yrs	Why	"Why is she crying?"
4-5 yrs	How	"How does that go in there?"
